New O&B Newsletter Format

The Orange & Black is still battling file size limitations on all O&B mailings. In on going efforts to limit and control unwanted "Spam" mailings a maximum file size limit of 5 mb has been placed on all of our mailings. There is never a problem with Special Edition mailings because they are so small, usually only one or two pages. But because the O&B Newsletter is so much larger it has been exceeding the 5 mb limit for sometime now. I have tried numerous solutions of compressing the file but none have been satisfactory.

It seems, at least for the time being, the only solution that doesn't sacrifice the quality of the finished product to an unacceptable degree is to just make each newsletter smaller in size.

I have been working on this newsletter for the past month now and it was 20 pages long. The smallest I was able to compress the file size to was to 6.6 mb. Totally too large to send out. Therefore, starting with this issue I am going to experiment with dividing each newsletter into two mailings. My first effort will be to send out the "Letters To The Editor" first in their own newsletter and then follow up with a 2nd newsletter that will be the news and feature stories. To make it easy for you to know which mailing is which, I will add, "Ltrs." after the issue # in the subject line for the issue containing the editor letters.


