Mary Jo Wegner Arboretum is a historic 115-acre plot rich with evidence of the past - stone quarries, rail lines, building foundations, town roads, and more, which began as a dream. A local visionary for the environment, Mary Jo Wegner imagined a natural haven in Sioux Falls with wetlands, gardens and native plants. The Arboretum provides recreation and education. <u>Sanford Sports Complex</u> is 162 acres that will serve and excite people of all ages and all walks of life. If you can play it... it will be available on this complex. 2210 West Pentagon Place, Sioux Falls, SD 57107

<u>Veterans' Memorial Park</u> - The dream of a veterans' memorial that recognizes the military history of our community and allows for a place to reflect on the sacrifices that all veterans made has been realized.

First inspired by Msgr. James Andrasckho of Holy Spirit Church, the vision became reality as the City of Sioux Falls and veterans organizations embraced the idea. A committee began by researching various ideas, meeting with designers, veterans groups and the public. A professional design team refined those ideas and a master plan was developed for the Park.

The US Army Air Corps used the selected site, North of Terrace Park, during World War II. The park, which was dedicated on September 9, 2006, includes an entryway with flags, plazas, walls, and an amphitheater. The design of the park allows for memorials to be built over time in various spaces. 1021 West Bailey Street, Sioux Falls, SD 57104.

In Search of Sampson

As a member of the class of '53 at Washington High School, I came into contact with a school mascot and his story continues to interest me. I am searching for information about this mascot. Washington High was the home of the Warriors and Indian motives festooned everything about the school.

Members of the Sanford Hi-Y took the Indian mascot idea a step further by creating a paper mache

grinning Indian statue. The picture attached shows Hi-Y members, Buzz Hyden, Jim Dalton and one other lad, making the statue.

For reasons I have never understood the mascot was named Sampson. I thought that a strange name under the circumstances but I said nothing as I was not directly involved with its creation. Sampson was displayed by Sanford Hi-Y on a number of occasions and our classmates thought we had created something special. When Sampson was not in use, he was stored in Buzz Hyden's garage.

The details are fuzzy with me but at some point there was an election being conducted at WHS and Sanford Hi-Y was supporting a candidate. Another candidate, Dick Wold, one of WHS's stellar athletes, was running in opposition. His supporters snuck into the Hyden garage and purloined Sampson. Suddenly, Sampson appeared on stage in the WHS



auditorium with a large sign about his neck proclaiming "Sampson supports Wold." Some memories are indelibly imprinted in your mind. I can still see the look of incredulity on Buzz Hyden's face when he saw Sampson that day. The only other bit of Sampson's history I knew about before I began my search was that due to some rough handling Sampson's head was knocked off his body.

When recently I had the pleasure of discovering Jack Phillip's wonderful Orange and Black newsletter, I saw that the Sampson image still appeared from time to time. I learned from Ron and Steve Veenker who were graduates of classes later than mine that Sampson was burned in the boiler at WHS. I also learned that Steve Veenker's Dramatic's Club revived the mascot. Younger brothers of some of the class of '53 built a new Sampson. I have not seen a picture of it, nor do I know anything of its history.

I have been told that the administration of the school disapproved of the original Sampson - hence its demise in the boiler. This makes me wonder whether there was some early form of "political correctness" that objected to the Indian motive. I am totally uniformed on this and I confess that I do not even know if the Warrior motive is still in use.

I am writing this brief piece with the hope that some of the O&B newsletter readers might know more of Sampson's history.
