<u>Veterans' Memorial Park</u> - The dream of a veterans' memorial that recognizes the military history of our community and allows for a place to reflect on the sacrifices that all veterans made has been realized.

First inspired by Msgr. James Andrasckho of Holy Spirit Church, the vision became reality as the City of Sioux Falls and veterans organizations embraced the idea. A committee began by researching various ideas, meeting with designers, veterans groups and the public. A professional design team refined those ideas and a master plan was developed for the Park.

The US Army Air Corps used the selected site, North of Terrace Park, during World War II. The park, which was dedicated on September 9, 2006, includes an entryway with flags, plazas, walls, and an amphitheater. The design of the park allows for memorials to be built over time in various spaces. 1021 West Bailey Street, Sioux Falls, SD 57104.







As I was gathering my notes and, wits, as Jim Ward '53 previewed in the last edition, I realized that a lot of what happened to our class was after most readers' time at WHS.

For example, the class of 1959 was the last group to go 9 years in grade school and all 4 years at WHS. The class of '60 went through Junior Highs and then 3 years downtown. BUT one school building was not ready in time,

so the Edison 9th grade class took over the west wing of WHS. But, lest they be unduly corrupted by us old timers, the Classes of '56 thru '59 used the other three wings. That was a chore, if you had to go from Band to Biology lab, you had to charge though the north, East, and South wings and down three flights of stairs. Same trip in reverse for Biology to Physics. But we were forbidden to use the West wing halls.

The Fifty-Niners made a splash on stage. The children's play was *Rumpelstiltkin*, and the title role went to a freshman, Sheldon Zabel. And after *Time out for Ginger* auditions, the ingénue role went to Vicki Brubaker. Barney Kremer knew our dad was a union stagehand running the lights at the Coliseum, and since the WHS auditorium switchboard was similar, I got drafted as apprentice to Rollie Chambers '56, to work lights for every play, concert, talent show, and assembly for four years. I never saw any from the auditorium.

In 1956 the Dramatics Club was wondering whether to have an OLD float, and if so what it might be. Nobody had a really winning concept, till Sheldon mentioned that our brothers Ron

and Bill's class of '54 had a statue replica of the Buzz Book Sampson, but there was no trace of it by the time we arrived.

We checked around and the word from a reliable source was some front office person couldn't stand the thing and had it incinerated in the boilers below the cafeteria.

We agreed that it would be fitting if we recreated Sampson for OLD and after.

Lynn Engen, science teacher, let us use their garage for the project. Several of us, including Mary Feldhaus and Barb Sales '58, and Mr. Engen's daughter, scavenged or scrounged some 2x4s, 1x2 lath, chicken wire, and papier-maché and set to it, using a Buzz Book cover as our model. Like a Phoenix from the ashes. Stop rolling your eyes!

Along the way, Sheldon and I were lamenting the boiler room immolation of Sampson I. Friends since Kindergarten, even in the '40s, the two of us made our annual bicycle pilgrimage to Sioux Falls Fireworks with our savings. We bought Black Cat and Zebra firecrackers. (I still have a package in storage.) When the Rich Bros.' red and blue flier came out in June we would sit in our back yard and scheme how to invest our savings. Then we would ride up to the city limits, which in 1950 meant an easy half block to 33rd Street, and the farmland adjacent to the Woodlawn Cemetery property, which was rented as cornfields. There we would set off a daily ration of Zebras, saving most for July Fourth of course.

(For decades Mom would send me the Rich flier from her mail, and I would bring it to lunch with Sheldon in Chicago, where we would reminisce about our allowances long since gone up with a bang.)

So when we built Sampson][Sheldon and I wrapped several packs of firecrackers in plastic bags and secured them inside his chicken wire ribcage. If our mascot found the same destiny as the first, people would hear about it.


After OLD, Sampson resided in the Veenker basement, and Fred Stahmann '59, Sheldon and I would lug him to basketball games at the Coliseum, and some football games at the old Howard Wood Field or to the OLD pep rally in the auditorium.

Upon graduating we passed Sampson along to someone in the class of 1960. I never heard what happened to it. Maybe some of your readers with younger siblings will have a trail to follow. Hope so! Hope we hear from others who worked on or inherited Sampson.




