SHOULD WE ADD A SUNDAY FAREWELL BREAKFAST?

At past reunions we have always had a Sunday morning breakfast as sort of a farewell event. Some of them have been referred to as "A Prayer Breakfast". After obtaining both Wayne and Rogers' approval and support, I would like for us to add a Sunday morning breakfast again this year. I feel a "private" dining room is necessary so we can have a short informal program. Of course in order to obtain a private dinning room a minimum attendance figure is needed by the restaurant. So first of all I need to know how many of you will attend such a breakfast on Sunday morning at 10 AM?

If you will attend then I need your preference between the two options outlined below. The Holiday Inn City Centre will give us a private room, but their requirement is that everyone would be served their Breakfast Brunch, which I am told is a very nice brunch. Our price would be the seniors price of \$10.95 per person plus tax and tip for a total of \$14.00 per person. Holding the event at the Holiday Inn has several advantages such as connivence for those staying there and having to check out that morning.

The other option is holding the breakfast at The Sheraton Inn located maybe 2 miles from The Holiday Inn. They will provide a private room for us and everyone would be allowed to order off the menu since they no longer offer a buffet. The advantage to the Sheraton Inn is that you can order whatever you want and your price would depend on what you order. The disadvantage is the distance from the headquarter hotel.



Well, here is a short summary of what I did after leaving Washington High. I am sorry that it is not as exciting and interesting as a lot of our classmates but I found that I had a very interesting and rewarding career. Actually, it was 2 careers — one in aerospace and one in the engineering/construction field. I started out at Augustana but found that I was going behind financially faster than I

was going ahead scholastically so I went to radar school at Lowry Air Force Base for the South Dakota Air National Guard where I got paid for going to school. Upon returning to Sioux Falls, I found the job market was not all that great so I moved to Seattle where I went to for Boeing work electronics flight line inspector on the B-52 bombers, KC-135 tankers and the 707 airliners. there, I moved California where I worked for Space Technogies, Aeronutronics Division of Ford and North American Aviation doing electronics design on various missiles, spacecraft and also designed the electrical package for the Apollo Lunar Excursion Module (LEM) Descent Engine so I have 6 packages still on the moon. During this time, I managed to squeeze in a fantastic trip to Tahiti and Bora Bora. result of this trip, I met a my wife, Fran Kollefrath, who was working for the US Air Force in Los Angeles having just returned from 3 years as Secretary to the Air Attaché in the US Embassy in London and in the Air Force OSI in Germany. We had 35 ½ wonderful years before she died from diabetes. I have two wonderful children. Erin who has her doctorate in education and Tim who is a pilot for Alaska Air Lines and one very smart 6 year old grandson, Jordan.

University in 1967 and left California. I continued in aerospace and served Electrical Power Systems Flight Controller at Mission Control in Houston for Apollo 13 thru Apollo 16 plus the Skylab program. I wrote the handbooks for the astronauts and was awarded the coveted NASA Snoopy Award by Astronaut, Charles Conrad from the Astronaut Corps. It was very interesting, exciting and working honor with the

astronauts that walked on the moon. The astronauts and flight controllers become very close friends so it was not just three men up there – it was three of our friends. From there, Aeronutronic Division of Ford Motor Co. called me back to do some engineering evaluation on a laser guided smart bombs so I spent 4 months on the aircraft

carrier, USS Ranger, in the Tonkin Gulf in Viet Nam as the

evaluation was being done in combat. It was a booming success to say the least. The squadron of A-6 I n t r u d e r s , VA-145, gained a reputation in the fleet of "one bombone bridge".

I then took a few years out of the aerospace industry

and worked as Project Controls Manager for Bechtel building pipelines in Saudi Arabia and nuclear power plants in the US. This was OK, but I liked the challenges of aerospace and came back to Boeing where I was Subcontracts Manager on the B-2 Stealth Bomber and the F-22 Raptor Stealth Fighter where I finally hung it up when they offered us the "golden handshake" and retired in 1995. This was great as it allowed me to have three good years of retirement with my wonderful wife, Fran, before she died in 1998. I left out a lot of programs I worked on that are still highly classified so I can't talk about them.

I have been enjoying retirement and now live in a

quaint little seaport town of Gig Harbor, WA in a nice, gated senior community. I have taken a dozen or more cruises to Alaska, the Caribbean, Australia, Tasmania and New Zealand. I even have a certificate that says I was stepping across the Arctic Circle on 9/11/2001. It took me an extra week and a nice long bus ride from Fairbanks, AK down through Canada on the Alcan Highway that I hadn't really planned on since all airlines were grounded. It was a real adventure and I would not trade it for anything but it did give me a good appreciation for what refugees go through! End
