No, I didn't win. I did find out how difficult it is to perform on a stage. I had a great time, met a wonderful and supportive group of ladies from all over the United States, and I invited them

I'm in the class of '58. You graduated when I was a Freshman in WHS. I'm a retired petroleum geologist. I went into the Navy upon graduating from WHS.

I went to Macalester after completing the tour in the Navy and went to UND in Grand Forks completing my Masters in Geology. My wife comes from Herman, MN and I meet her at Macalester. We have two sons: one lives in

Destin (Coast Guard career) and the other lives in Destin, FL (medical doctor). We have four grandchildren (three boys and a girl).

My Dad, Ray Clark, worked for Triangle School Service. He worked for Dempster Christianson.

I graduated from a fine school: Washington High School. It prepared me well for college. Regards,

Kingwood was annexed by Houston in about 2003. Kingwood is located about 6 miles

NE of Bush Intercontinental Airport. Our school system is Humble ISD and not part of Houston. The fire and police protection are by Houston, but I pay property taxes to Humble (Humble ISD) and Houston.

You need to know that I have a neurological condition that effects my vocal chords and I can't speak at all without a speech synthesizer. I can speak on the phone with extreme difficulty. I don't talk on the phone except if my wife calls me. I rely on e-mail for almost all my communications. I go to the YMCA and workout 3 times a week, and am a fan of "Silver Slippers".

I can drive and that means a lot to me. In case I get "picked up" by the police, I carry a card that says "I can't speak properly" and lists neurological doctors (phone numbers) at Baylor School of Medicine. Thankfully, I live in Houston which is a medical center.

Ginny is a 5th grade teacher at Willow Creek School. It's in the Humble ISD and she took retirement about 6 years ago. She teaches on a yearly contract basis.

I'm 70 now and can't work as a geologist because I can't speak. Speaking is an important part of being a petroleum geologist; you have to "sell" your ideas to management about drilling a well (exploration or development well).
