

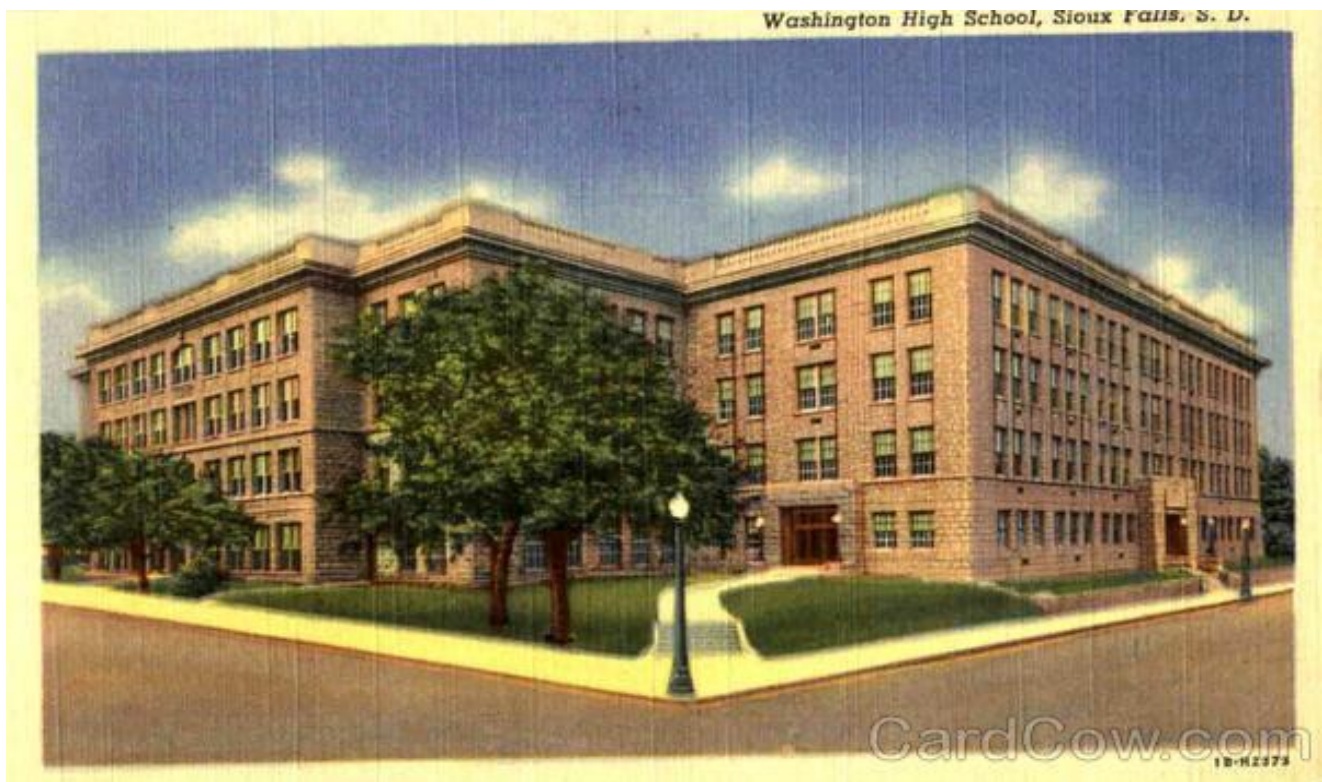

Did You Know?

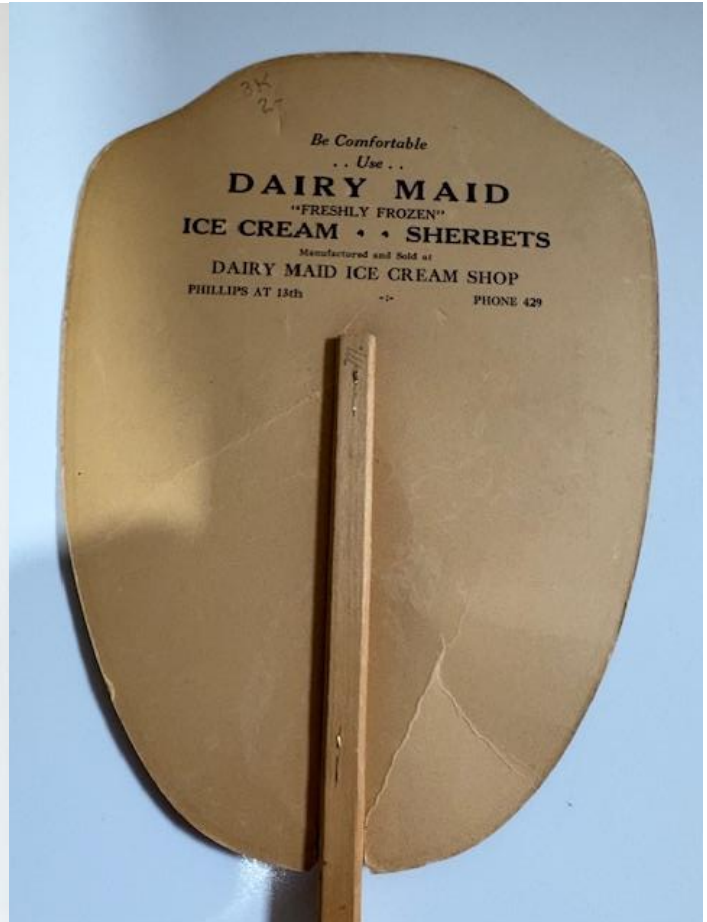
Washington High School in Sioux Falls, SD, has a history dating back to 1879 when high school classes first began, eventually moving to a new building in 1908 and being renamed from Sioux Falls High School. The original 1908 building was the site of the Washington Pavilion today and served as a high school until 1992 when the new high school building was completed.

- **Early history:** High school classes started in Sioux Falls in 1879, with 20 students in the first year. The school was named Irving School in 1885 before being renamed Washington High School.
- **1908 building:** The 1908 building was the first dedicated high school building for the district and was renamed Washington High School upon its completion. Three hundred twenty-eight students moved into the new building on February 14, 1908.
- **Later years and new building:** In 1992, the 1908 building closed, and Washington High School moved to a new building. The old building was renovated to become the Washington Pavilion, which opened in 1999.
- **Current Washington High School:** Today's Washington High School is a separate, modern facility located at 501 N. Sycamore Ave. It is a public-school serving grades 9-12 in Sioux Falls.

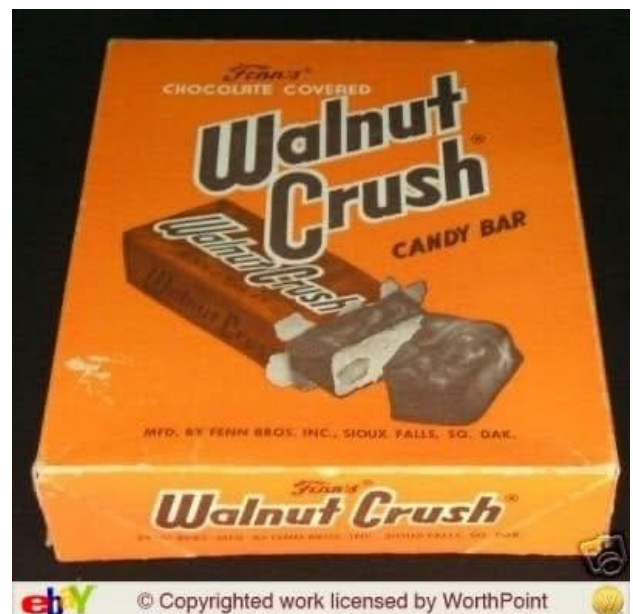


This started me thinking about Fenn Brothers, ice cream, candy and milk. loved butter brickle ice cream and Walnut Crush candy bars.
