On the eve of a New Year that we hope will be less filled with the suffering of others, including the people of Ukraine, and will ease the concerns that weighed on all of us, we are sending by mail a small contribution in appreciation of your extraordinary efforts to keep Washington High alumni in touch. A part of it is in memory of **Tom Muilenburg '58**, my high-school debate partner, the best man at our wedding, and a life-long friend through college years and after.

We are doing as well as one might expect two members of a 1958-high school class to do. A few nicks and dents, but upright and active. We have lived in the suburbs of Boston, with a second home on Cape Cod, since graduate school days. Over the years we raised a daughter, born our sophomore year in college, and son, who arrived five years later. They, in turn, with their spouses have gifted us five grandchildren—the oldest 32 and the youngest 21. All of them nearby, with the exception of our California granddaughter, and all of them with interesting careers, again, with the exception of our youngest granddaughter, who, after a year in the army as a medic, is in college.

Gloria retired from secondary-school teaching and as dean of faculty at the Cambridge School of Weston, an independent school, twenty years ago, and has, beyond the special attention she gives to the family, remained extremely



involved with church activity, gardening, book clubs, and community groups. (Before retiring, I used to say, "I couldn't afford to retire. I didn't have that much energy.") I did retire from Columbia University in 2008, after thirty years of commuting weekly between Boston and New York City.

I have let the rocking chair on the porch sit and have continued with the things I did before: co-directing a master's program at two major Moscow universities, now suspended because of Putin's madman's war, and working with a university consortium (Columbia-Harvard-Oxford-Sciences Po (Paris)-and two Moscow universities, the participation of the latter suspended as well because of the war). It is a joint effort to train a new generation of specialists to deal better with the issues than our generation has. A colleague at Princeton and I have also just concluded guiding a multi-year project at the American Academy of Arts and Sciences that addressed the challenges posed by a multipolar nuclear world. Again, many thanks, for all that you do to make the *Orange & Black* so filled with memories and a space for those of us who were lucky enough to grow up in Sioux Falls in the tender 1950s to share stories.

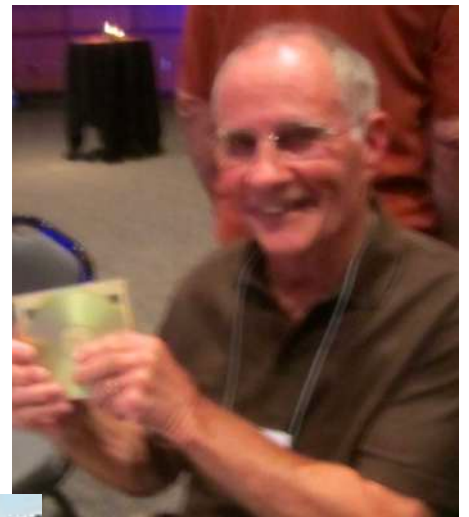

Hi Jack,

Your publications always bring back fond memories of those glorious days of the 50's in Sioux Falls and WHS. Days as an Argus-Leader paperboy, work at Rich Brother's Fireworks, time spent at the YJCA as a swimming pool aide and pinsetter in the bowling alley, as a caddie at Minnehaha Country Club, a construction worker on the then new I-29 and a meat cutter at John Morrell. As a member of the Amalgamated Meat Cutters Union, I could buy bacon at the company store for 11 cents a pound (still love bacon). I attended Jefferson and Emerson grade schools. Growing up at 1215 So. Lake Ave., I recall trips to Sioux Valley Hospital where my mother worked...where I could get a coke in a bottle for a nickel and add some peanuts. And ventures to Alicks (Joe & Rich) Super Market at 18<sup>th</sup> and Grange. At WHS I was assigned to Mr. Wilson's home room in the woodworking area in the basement and having to make it in time to algebra class on the top corner of the 4<sup>th</sup> floor. I recall playing basketball for LaMone (Harlan) HI-Y at the YMCA and hanging out with Arlon Berkhof (Cedar Rapids, Iowa) and riding around in Paul Knaus' (deceased) Mercury with Cliff Eggers (deceased) and Trevor Thorpe (somewhere in California). We would all chip in a few cents for gas and end up at the Barrel Drive Inn. Gas wasn't much but we didn't have much. I could go on and on with memories of those days.

Following WHS graduation in 1958 I decided I wanted to become a civil engineer so enrolled at SD State. But in August, for some unknown reason, I decided to head down to USD where I became a member of the Lambda Chi Alpha Fraternity. I subsequently graduated in 1992 with a BS degree in Business Administration. I soon went to work as an insurance adjuster that led me to contacts with lawyers because of casualty claims work. I noticed the lawyers all drove fancy cars, had plush offices with expensive oak desks and nice thick shag carpeting. That looked pretty good to me so I enrolled in Law School at USD in the fall of 1963 graduating with the then new JD degree in '66. Wanting to venture out, I decided to move to San Francisco to establish California residence and take the California Bar exam. Having received a top-notch education at WHS and USD, I was fortunate to pass that exam. During this time, I became aware of an opportunity in Fort Collins, Colorado. This required yet another bar exam. I had left California a few days that summer to return to Pierre to take the South Dakota Bar exam. The Bar Examiners passed 100 percent of us in those days.



Fort Collins was, and still is, a city very similar in many ways to Sioux Falls. I worked with a small law firm there and subsequently set up my own law practice. The local District Attorney decided not to run for re-election in 1972. I had become interested in criminal law and got the political bug so decided to run for election as the District Attorney for the Eighth Judicial District of Colorado. I enjoyed the work as the chief prosecutor in the North Central area of Colorado. I continued on to serve 8 four-year terms as the elected prosecutor. I was elected a couple of times as president of the Colorado District Attorneys Association. In 1999 I was elected to serve as President of the National District Attorney's Association headquartered in Washington DC. These were all very rewarding experiences. I retired as the District Attorney in 2005 and joined my son's law firm in Fort Collins. I practiced law with him for about 6 years and decided to phase into retirement.

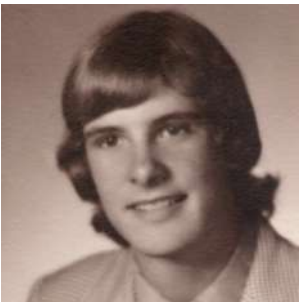
I always had a yearning to move to the warmth of the desert in the southwest so my wife Kathy and I decided to move to Arizona where we were snowbirds for several years before deciding to settle permanently in Sun City, Arizona, also known as God's waiting room. Sun City is the original Del Webb retirement community with a wide variety of housing options. We have access to 9 golf courses and several modern recreation facilities. Kathy and I try to "work out" regularly and play golf year around. The summers do get hot but during the three-month heat wave we tee off early and finish before the triple figure temperatures set in. They say it's a dry heat.

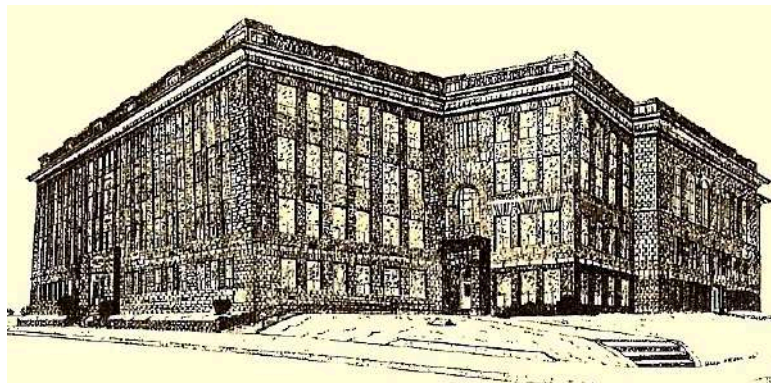

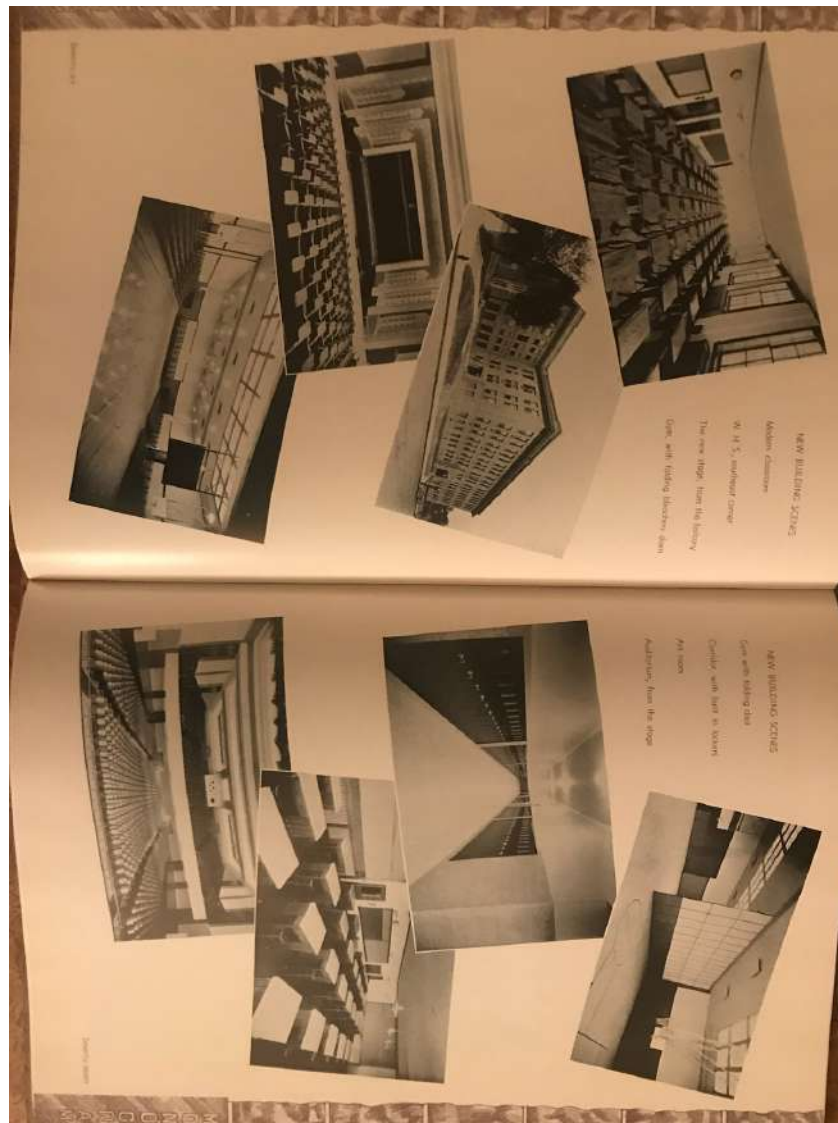

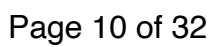

Hi Jack from snowy South Dakota. I came across this photo (top of next page.) of a football team with Elmer T Hansen's name on it.

He came to WHS in 1936 as assistant track and football coach for 13 years. From 1949 to 1970 he was head cross country and track coach. And also was the auto mechanics teacher. I had him for auto mechanics.

Elmer attended Morningside College about 1924-27 and held the North Central Conference records in the 440 yard dash and 880 yard run. I found no mention

of his being on this Morningside football team, so not sure if he was or not. Don't see a face that could look like Elmer, maybe his friends team photo. While going to Morningside he lived in a apartment at 3915 Orleans Ave in Sioux City near the college. He competed in the first Dakota Relays in 1923.

Prior to WHS he coached basketball, football and track at Lennox High school from 1930-1935, then at Waverly, Iowa for one year. He received the Siouxland Coaches Association Award in 1970, Morningside College Alumni Award in 1971 and was inducted into the South Dakota High School Coaches Association Hall of Fame in 1976. He had been timekeeper at all Howard Wood Field football games and basketball games from 1936 until retiring in 1970. He was also the timekeeper for Augustana basketball, football games and the North Central basketball tournament. It was said that the "T" in Elmer T Hansen will always stand for track.

Born in Kanaranzi, Minnesota June 13, 1905 he died September 24, 1986 age 81. Married to Mildred Garrett Hansen on June 8, 1939 they lived at 1120 So Walts Ave most of their life. They had one daughter, Mary Ann Hansen, born in 1940, who was killed in a auto accident near Alexandra, SD July 11, 1953. Mrs. Hansen survived but was in critical condition, Elmer was not with them, but another driver who caused the accident was killed.

Other interesting notes, he was a hail adjuster the summer of 1951 along with fellow teachers Joe Lemohn and Felix Schwartz. In 1970 he became the area rep for Encyclopaedia Britannica.

Thought this made for a good story on a faculty member the 50's would remember.

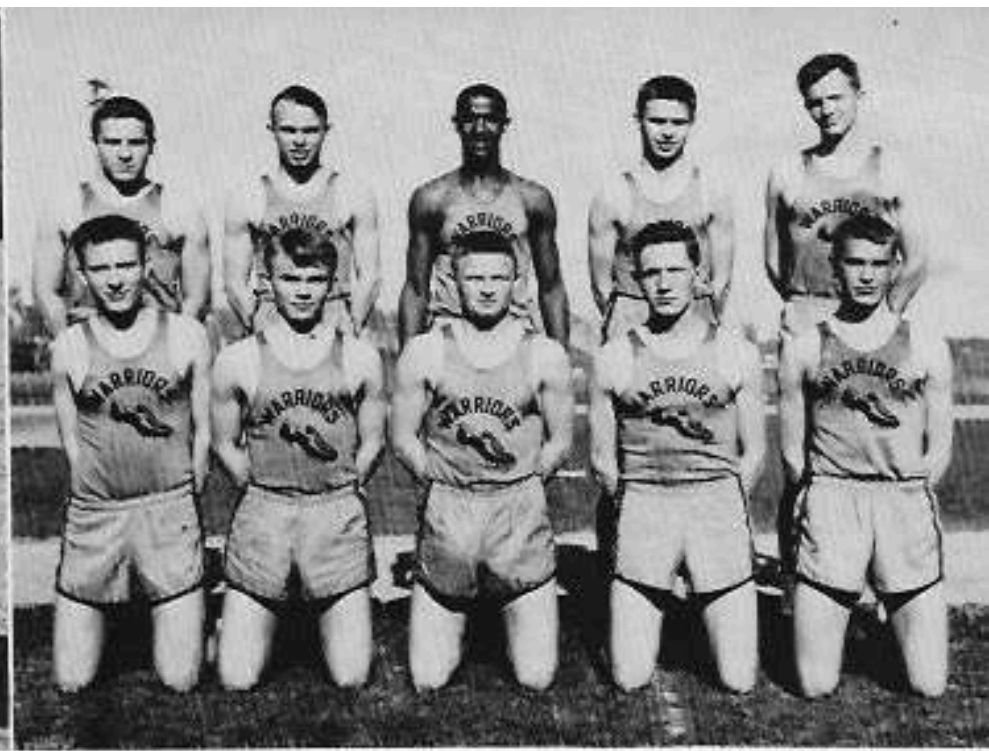

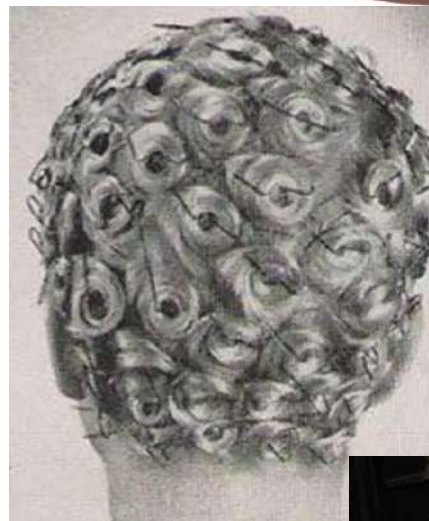

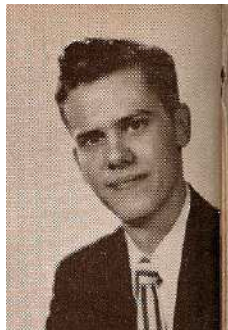
I always say, "I should write something about that" for the O&B. And like many of us, we never quite get around to it. I've been enjoying reading Facebook posts from **Jim Carlson '58** <pegandjim@sio.midco.net> with whom my brother and I attended Mark Twain in the late 40s. Jim's recent post about Ardeen Foss coming to WHS in 1950 brought back so many

memories. Ardeen was a visionary and he achieved so much for Sioux Falls. I and a whole cadre of WHS '54 kids were in the Mark Twain band and moved from there to the high school downtown when he did after Mr. Thompson's retirement. At the time, I was playing a cheap clarinet and sat in the 23<sup>rd</sup> chair out of 24 clarinets. **Neal Olson** and **Larry Hartshorn '54** were the oboists of Ardeen's first band. There was one more oboe, owned by the band, that was not in use. Mr. Foss asked me if I were interested in learning it. Here's how my immature mind worked: "I could move from 23<sup>rd</sup> chair to 3<sup>rd</sup> chair without knowing anything!" So, I began. Ardeen was a consummate clarinetist and oboist himself. Over the years he trained an impressive number of double-reed players (not to even mention the bassoonists). Back in that time, Sioux Falls, funded through taxes, a municipal band directed by Russell Henegar who had played in the Sousa Band. It was a union group, American Federation of Musicians, and more than a few of us from Ardeen's band were accepted into the city band. While that was a great experience for us youngsters, the most exciting gig that we had was to play in the pit orchestra for the traveling company of "South Pacific" out of New York City. The orchestra traveled with some key NY musicians and a conductor. They filled out the rest with local union players across the country. I am still amazed when I think back about mixing with professional New York musicians at age 16. It was a heady experience. I can't remember with certainty who else from our class was in the pit, but I'm quite sure that **Tom Knutson '54** and **Warren Gedstad '54** were there. Would love to hear from any of the rest of you who may shared that exciting experience.
