

e were back in Canada for three weeks in January of 1963 on tour with Dorsey Burnette, who had two big hits at the time: *Hey Little One* and *Tall Oak Tree*. Dorsey was the brother of Johnny Burnette who also was a singer and both brothers were good songwriters. Dorsey could see that my

band was going over well with the Canadian audiences and Dorsey offered to produce a recording

session with me in California as soon as the tour was done. Recording during those days was most often done using studio musicians, not bands that were use to playing for live audiences. When I got to Los Angeles, Dorsey picked me up at the hotel and on to the studio we went. I was thrilled when Dorsey told me the musicians he had lined up. They were Ricky Nelson's band, the ones we saw each week on *The Ozzie and Harriet Show*; Earl Palmer was on drums, James Burton lead guitar, Joe Osborn on bass and Glen Campbell on rhythm guitar. Glen was a studio player and was not famous yet at that time. We had four girl background singers and Dorsey sang harmony with me on each of the four songs we recorded.

Dorsey placed *Town Girl* on the Keen Record Label and it became a regional hit for us. It was such a thrill for me to be able to work with people like that and after the three-hour session, we stopped by the Ozzie and Harriet studio, where all the weekly TV shows were done, and I got



to meet Ozzie who produced and wrote all those shows. As we drove in the back parking lot, the

first four parking spots were marked "Ozzie", "Harriet", "David" and "Ricky." Those people live in a whole different world than most of us will ever experience.



That was quite a drive!

Later that summer, we played a whole week in one spot. It was the Texas Teen Fair in San Antonio, Texas. George Jones opened each show at 10:00 a.m. with his big crossover hit *The Race is On* followed by Bobby Rydell. We were the third act on stage, but were out of there each day by 1:00 p.m. and had the hot Texas afternoons to spend in the swimming pool at the Holiday Inn. The group that closed the show each morning you may have heard of: they were the Rolling Stones. Around ten years


In the summer of 1963, we were once again on tour with Bobby Vee. We mostly traveled 200-300 miles a day between dates. Once in a while we would have a longer drive, like the time we played the grandstand

show for the Regina, Saskatchewan (Canada) fair and

two days later we played the Pennsylvania State Fair.

ago, Keith Richards of the Stones was doing a show at the Target Center in Minneapolis and my drummer, Stu Perry, got to go back stage after the show to visit with Richards. A conversation about that week in Texas back in 1963 came up and Keith said he still remembered the name Myron Lee and the Caddies because that was their first tour to the U.S. and we were the first American band that they worked with.

We played our last date that summer in LaCrosse, Wisconsin and were headed home. I was riding with Bobby Vee that day and he said that he would be the headliner for *The Dick Clark Caravan of Stars* in November. Clark needed a



band that could back up twelve major acts and he asked Bobby if he knew of anyone. Bobby said he did and would get back with him. Now here comes the line – "Sometimes it's not what you know, it's who you know." The chance to get to work for a guy like Dick Clark is slim to none, but Bobby got me the job and we worked the 1963 North American Tour and came back and did the next one in 1965. We had a lot of big music stars on these shows ... so we'll go on tour next time.

The Sioux Falls Washington Athletic Hall of Fame was founded on December 29, 1994. On that date, a meeting was called which included Ken Kessinger, Dick Day, John Odney, Jim Denevan, and Wayne Carney. At that meeting the concept of establishing a Washington High School Athletic Hall of Fame was discussed. It was decided at that time that a committee consisting of Ken Kessinger, Dick Day, Bob Johnson, Virg Sandvig, Arnie Bauer, Chris Dummermuth, JoElle Benson, John Odney, Jim Denevan, Marc Murren, Dean Mann, and Wayne Carney put together a constitution and by-laws for the Hall of Fame. At the January 31, 1995 meeting, Ken Kessinger and Dean Mann were selected as Co-Chairpersons of the WHS Athletic Hall of Fame Committee. At the March 8, 1995 meeting, JoElle Benson was selected as secretary and Marc Murren was selected as treasurer. Under the direction of Ken Kessinger and Dean Mann, the Constitution and By-Laws of the WHS Athletic Hall of Fame were drafted and approved at the April 26, 1995 meeting. The formal acceptance of the initial WHS Athletic Hall of Fame Committee was established with the following members: Ken Kessinger, Dick Day, Bob Johnson, Virg Sandvig, Arnie Bauer, Chris Dummermuth, JoElle Bensen, Jim Denevan, Marc Mureen, Dean Mann, Bruce Odson, and Wayne Carney.

The purpose of the Washington High School Athletic Hall of Fame is to recognize and honor former members of the coaching staff, administration, athletes, and contributors for their outstanding achievements and contributions to the athletic programs at Washington High School.


