Joyce retired with the rank of Col from the USAF and Dr for Chief Aviation Psychologist USAF. She was attached to an F=15 fighter squadron, "The Fighting Tigers". Her job was to "work with them, fly with them, and take care of their families". Prior to her AF career she was the first woman to work as a psychologist in a men's maximum security prison. Subsequently she was used often by the FBI and AF to solve murder cases. Eventually she was contacted by Interpol to profile the first international terrorists for their organization.

Dr. Teters also managed to raise her four children and is now a grandmother.



The following are more Sioux River pictures from the beautiful limited edition book **Jim Carlson** '58, gifted me titled, "Sioux Falls South Dakota, A PICTORIAL HISTORY", by, Gary D. Olson and Erik L. Olson





The new Eighth Street Bridge is shown here just after its completion in 1912. The old Cascade Mill Dam in the foreground was removed in 1959 as part of the Army Corps of Engineers's flood control project in the donentown area. Center for Western Studies photo

The original spillway near the Penitentiary was completed in 1908. This was the first real attempt at controlling spring floods on the Big Sioux by constructing a drainage ditch and spillway that carried excess water from north of the city directly to the river below the downtown area. It provided a shortcut for the river that avoided the downtown. A major flood in 1915 destroyed this spillway, and the city and the farmers north of the city argued for years over who should pay the cost of its replacement. The two parties finally agreed to share the cost, but the flood system was not perfected until the late 1950s. Center for Western Studies photo




Boating was popular in Sherman Park
about 1915. In 1910 E. A. Sherman, long
time businessman in Sioux Falls, gave the
city fifty-three acres of land along the river
for a park. The city constructed retaining
walls and a dam on the river to raise the
water level for swimming and boating. In
the late twenties or early thirties the city
built cabins in the park to house motoring here, in the 1920s, was the first improved

Sherman Park Swimming Area, shown bere, in the 1920s, was the first improved swimming facility in Sioux Falls, with the river being damned and lined with retaining walls in 1912-1913. In 1917 the bath house was built. It was the city's only swimming pool until the early Thirties when a swimming area was opened at Covell Lake and the Drake Springs pool was constructed. The trolley line on Twenty-second Street provided transportation to the Sherman Park swimming hole until the trolley ceased operations in 1929. Siouxland Heritage Museums photo

The old viaduct, built in 1890 to allow the East Sioux Falls Trolley to cross the railroad right-of-ways, was unable to accommodate the heavy traffic generated by United States Highway 16. 


A fire swept through the Queen Bee Mill in 1956, and in 1961—for safety reasons—the walls were knocked down to the first floor. The mill, built in 1879-81, as the most modern flour mill in the entire Midwest, ran only about a dozen years during its existence. Siouxland Heritage Museums photo



'51/'52 WHS HOMECOMING

This old quote from the '51 OLD Marshall, Ike Hoover, is a great lead into us fondly remembering the 1951 WHS Homecoming.

Ike Hoover

Back in 1951, when Marshal Ike Hoover reigned over WHS homecoming, the activities the students participated in were simpler then they are now. "Back then it was just a few things," Hoover said. "Coronation was Thursday night. The guys wore suits and ties and the gals wore white gowns. The pep rally was in the morning on Friday in the auditorium and the parade was at about 1 p.m. We rode in convertibles and waved. We also worked on floats—all the classes and school clubs made float. They were usually on a flatbed truck and pulled by a car. We worked far into the night to put them together. Times were simpler then. The parade went down Main and up Phillips. We didn't do everything during the week like they do now."

Jack, I hope this won't be too boring for your readers - I am celebrating 2 birthdays this year. My 80th of age and my beloved Marine Corps at the age of 245 years old. The following story is one I often used when teaching the kids I was assigned with. The students were kids who were sent to our special program designed to help them learn to work with others to develop better skills, to be more sociable with others in their lives, and to complete their education successfully.

Also I really enjoyed the latest O&B. Always great reading and so interesting for so many to write in and add to the O&B. Thank you, Jack, for one more publication of great memories from the '50's.

This year, on my birthday, on November 7th, 2020, it will mark 63 years to the day that I joined the US Marine Corps. I signed enlistment papers on November 7th, 1957 at the age of 17 years. Al Omar and Don Rotherham, both of '58, joined with me and we all trained together in the same Basic Training Platoon 343. We were in what was called a "delayed entry program". We were members of the Marine Reserves here in town. That meant that when we were finished with high school Uncle Sam wanted to see us at the Marine Corps Recruit Training Depot, San Diego, California. Needless to say we had a lot of interesting "events" during that summer of 1958. I am sending you a story of one tough basic training task of the many we had to complete.

I am sending a picture of "MCRD", San Diego, CA that shows the massive layout of the base and one picture of a young 19 year old kid taken at El Toro Marine Corps Air Station. It really is me! 147 pounds of tough.


