It took all of my urging and persuasion to get this story from Jim. Altogether we exchanged well over a dozen emails trying to get him to share his and his wife's story.

At one point Jim wrote, "*Jack, I feel a little weird about this whole thing. People will wonder why you are writing this stuff about me. I think all our alumni have great stories and I am no different than any of them. It isn't that I want or need attention. If you do put anything in the O and B please say you asked me to update you or something to that effect.*

I have had a wonderful life, work I loved and a terrific family as I am sure most of our WHS grads have too. Everyone has a story and that is one of the things I loved as a physician getting to know my patients stories. JIM"

Okay Jim, - Readers, I not only asked Jim for his story, I pretty much begged him for it before he finally shared the following with me.

"Use whatever you want in here. Not trying to toot my own horn."

"After WHS 56 I enrolled in the University of Nebraska to study pre-medicine. In my senior year I got a date with a beautiful sophomore, Lynn Wright. I knew right then I would love to spend my life with her. After Nebraska I went to Chicago to the Northwestern University Medical school. Lynn and I stayed in touch via slow mail and occasional phone calls and rare trips to Lincoln to see her. As soon as she graduated we got married and moved to a south Chicago apartment. Lynn was an art major in college and got a job as a graphic designer for the AMA. She was fortunate that here design for an emergency medical symbol was selected and now is on every ambulance in the U.S. and most countries as well. After medical school graduation we moved to Minneapolis where I interned and where our first son Steve was born. While an intern in Minneapolis I enlisted in the Navy Reserve. After my internship we moved to Rochester when I did a residency in internal medicine at the Mayo Clinic. After that we moved to San Diego where I did a fellowship in Gastroenterology.. Our second son, Dave was born there. Following my fellowship I went on active duty in the U.S. Navy and eventually became a LCDR and chief of gastroenterology at the US Navy Balboa Hospital. Our daughter Kirsten was born in San Diego.

*From there we moved to Wenatchee in the north central part of Washington where I became the first gastroenterologist in the state between Seattle and Spokane. One year later at my encouragement **Dr. Dale Peterson '56 and his wife Cammy (Camille Larson WHS '61)**, and their 3 kids joined us our clinic with Dale as an urologist. They bought the house next to us and our combined 6 kids grew up together. I practiced GI for 38 years and also was the CEO of our medical center for 6 years. I retired at age 67. In Washington we have enjoyed hiking, climbing, fishing, skiing and all outdoor activities available to us in this beautiful state. My wife Lynn is in my opinion an outstanding pastel artist. Lynn has shown her art around the area in many juried and invitational shows and has won several cash awards. In the N.W. Pastel International 2010 Show she won the Dakota Pastel Award. She was also the 2010 Festival of Trees artist and in 2000 she was the Apple Blossom poster artist. She was the featured artist for Two Rivers Gallery in 2011 and in 2017 (Oct.). She has had two different two-person shows at WVC Graves Gallery and has work permanently on display at the Wenatchee Valley Clinic. Currently her work can be seen at Pav's in Leavenworth and at Two Rivers Gallery in Wenatchee.
