Then click on their names. It should show you a picture of the person, or at least their bio and medals.


This really is an amazing web site. Someone spent a lot of time and effort to create it.

Don Skaro, who attended 9 Olympics, dies at age 60

Since 1964, Don Skaro attended nine summer Olympics in a row. He was one of only 900 Ameri-

cans who attended the 1980 games in Moscow.

"He's always been a sports nut," said his sister, Janet Seidell of Milwaukee.

During his military service, Skaro was stationed in Korea, Don where he was in Army security. He also played on the Army basketball team.

Because the 1964 Olympics were held in Tokyo, the basketball team decided to attend the games.

"He got hooked on the Olympics right away," his sister said.

Donald M. Skaro, 60, of 4618 S. Louise Ave. died Saturday, Aug. 28, 1999, at Sioux Valley Hospital & University Medical Center of a heart attack.

He was a member and past chairman of the South Dakota Olympic Committee.

Skaro led several tours to the

Olympics.

In 1976, he brought a group of 40 people to the games in Montre-

Through his whole life, Skaro was an avid sports enthusiast.

Skaro enjoyed attending high school and college games.

His favorite sports were trackand-field events and women's vol-

The University of South Dakota alumnus never missed a basketball or football game.

He was an avid golfer, taking golf trips to Ireland and Scotland. On his 60th birthday his sister and brother-in-law took him to Palm Springs, Calif., to golf.

In addition to sports, Skaro was an active member of First Lutheran Church. He was an usher for several years and a chairman of the 21st Century Fund Drive.

Donald Martin Skaro was born April 17, 1939, in Sioux Falls. He attended Lowell Elementary School. He graduated from Wash-



School in 1957. He received his bachelor's degree in political science from the University South Dakota in 1961 and was a member of Delta Tau Delta Fraterni-

He served in the Army from 1961 to 1964. After his discharge he worked for Royal Globe Insurance Co. in Des Moines, Kansas City, Mo., and Omaha.

In 1973, he returned to Sioux Falls and began working for Raven Industries. He was the sales manager for Swing West Ski Wear until the early 1980s. He continued his career in marketing and sales most recently with MMS Incentives of Atlanta.

Skaro served on the Howard Wood Dakota Relay board, the Sioux Falls Chamber of Commerce Sports and Recreation Committee and was a chairman of the NCC Holiday Tournament.

Skaro awaits Seoul treat

Right now, of course, it's bobbing bobsleds, ski flying, scoring disputes in figure skating, and greetings on impact in front of a hockey net.

In seven months, the Olympics will be defrosted and have a quick change of clothes for a staging in

Then the emphasis will be on bobbing cances, flying high jumpers, scoring protests in gymnastics, and soccer collisions in a manifold of language.

Holding both the Winter and Summer Games in the same year creates sufficient discomfort that the situation will change in 1994.

The year 1982 will share both for a farewell double. They'll alternate every two years after that, the Winter Games in 1994, the Summer Games in 1996, the Winter Games in 1998, etc.

That will keep Olympiphiles like Don Skaro of Sioux Falls from missing one or the other.

Skaro, 48, South Dakota chairman for the United States Don Skaro Olympic Committee, is passing up Calgary in favor of his seventh consecutive Summer Games when

of his seventh consecutive Sammer Carious washing the 24th Olympiad is celebrated in autumn in Seoul.

"It's a matter of days and dollars," said Skaro, who is in the sign business. "I even had the offer of free housing if I had gone to Calgary. But there are times you simply can't do everything you'd like to

Skaro's string of Summer Games started in Tokyo in 1964, at a time when the U.S. Army was affording him his first visit to an area dominated right now by what is called Olympic Family Town

The area across the Han River from downto Seoul where the Games will be headquartered for lodging and competition "was rice paddles when I was stationed for 13 months in Korea in 1963-64," Skaro said. "I was at Yong-dong-po, six miles southwest of Seoul.

"Now, where I was is connected by subway to downtown Seoul. Such a thought would have been unheard of then when there wasn't a building in the city of more than three stories."

One of the differences today has to do with terrorism as demonstrated last November when a Korean Airlines plane was destroyed over Burma with 115 people aboard. The woman who confessed to planting a bomb on the airliner said that she did so in protest of holding the Summer Games in Seoul rather than using North Korea as a co-bast.

Park Seh-jik, who directs the Seoul Olympic Organizing Committee, said that although some discord might be expected, he was shooting for general harmony. It is to be ensured by security of a type that has kept the Korean halves out of war during more than 30 years of dual-restraint





This seems special to me but then it is my one and only experience with said initiative. Are you party to this happening here and there around the U S & Canada? Is it modeled elsewhere--Europe, China et al?

Allow me to say again that I have both a personal and professional interest. The social is situationally rewarding to see what has happened to Betty, Bob, and Bill over the years. The other is Professional or better clinical. I know I have mentioned briefly before my theory (perhaps fantasy) as to what is occurring here at the subliminal level prompted by your initiative and dedication for all your own reasons---indeed to a level that is inordinate and exemplary.---now so successful it is like a grass fire on the plains of S D....hard to shut down. The money is important and a useful symbol but I believe it to be # 2 if nor3 to 5 in the ranking of intention for your "Sponsors."

Footnote on the clinical:

My assessment, minimally documented through occasional observation of your work over several years, would have to be verified, modified, or rejected through some instrumentation----personal interview with each "Sponsor" or more practically as a first step thru a survey (of the survey produced at least a 30% response---standard for general public is 20% but these folks are above the mid-point of general population---in fact I would wager a survey of your Sponsors would produce a response in the range + or - of 93%).

I suggest for consideration that the driver is a neurological sequence researched by a Physician -Penfield, who's research highlighted the difference between "RECALL" and "RELIVE". This is a driving component in Transactional Analysis.

Recall = your phone # or wife's name

That RELIVE experance of the foundational experience at THE WHS is obviously important to folks -- life long.

The one is utilitarian; the other is therapeutic.

There is more that could be said but easier said than written about. This is perhaps to much said already, however, this experience seems worthy of in-depth review and examination. It is the point in organizational development where the "Board and CEO" make a decision, of continuance or discontinuance.

Power to you two in the New Year out there in the Sun-Country; we have not been down to "0" yet and no snow!

Also in all past years I have published an average of 75 "*Special Editions*" each year.but this year I have so far published 107 Special Editions.


I can only say thank you so very much for your vote of confidence and support through the Patron program. You have truly motivated and driven me to work harder for you every day.
