
Jack,



The best years to be born in the history of Earth & we got to experience it all. Thank God for all the times, the adventures, wars won, technology developed. Generations after future generations will never experience what we did. What a generation we turned out to be.

To Those of Us Born 1925 - 1955:

At the end of this email is a quote of the month by Jay Leno. If you don't read anything else, Please read what he said.

TO ALL THE

KIDS WHO SURVIVED THE 1930's, 40's and 50's !!

First, we survived being born to mothers who may have smoked and/or drank - While they were pregnant. They took aspirin, ate blue cheese dressing, tuna from a can, and didn't get tested for diabetes.

Then, after that trauma, we were put to sleep on our tummies in baby cribs covered with bright colored lead-based paints.

We had no childproof lids on medicine bottles, locks on doors or cabinets, and, when we rode our bikes, we had baseball caps, not helmets, on our heads.

As infants and children, we would ride in cars with no car seats, no booster seats, no seat belts, no air bags, bald tires and sometimes no brakes.

We would leave home in the morning and play all day, as long as we were back when the streetlights came on.

No one was able to reach us all day and, we were OKAY.

We would spend hours building our go-carts out of scraps and then ride them down the hill, only to find out that we forgot about brakes.

After running into the bushes a few times, we learned to solve the problem.

We did not have Play Stations, Nintendo and X-boxes. There were No video games, No 150 channels on cable, No video movies or DVDs, No surround-sound or CDs, No cell phones, No personal computers, No Internet and No chat rooms.

WE HAD FRIENDS and we went outside and found them!

We fell out of trees, got cut, broke bones and lost teeth, and there were no lawsuits from those accidents.

We would get spankings with wooden spoons, switches, ping-pong paddles, or just a bare hand, and no one would call child services to report abuse. We ate worms, and mud pies made from dirt, and the worms did not live in us forever.

We were given BB guns for our 10th birthdays, 22 rifles for our 12th, rode horses, made up games with sticks and tennis balls, and although we were told it would happen - we did not put out very many eyes.

We rode bikes or walked to a friend's house and knocked on the door or rang the bell, or just walked in and talked to them.

Little League had tryouts and not everyone made the team. Those who didn't had to learn to deal with disappointment.

Imagine that!!

The idea of a parent bailing us out if we broke the law was unheard of ... they actually sided with the law!

These generations have produced some of the best risk-takers, problem solvers, and inventors ever.

The past 60 to 85 years have seen an explosion of innovation and new ideas.

We had freedom, failure, success and responsibility, and we learned how to deal with it all.

If you are one of those born between 1925 & 1955, CONGRATULATIONS!





It was a recall/relive event for me to read thru your posting. As we have noted clinically in the past.....in my experience,

all of your/our postings are of interest because we at WHS are of the same "clan"......that is recall and is of great interest

Of course the above depicts positive occurrences; as we learned from Dr. Sidlow in WHS Physics

(equal and opposite reaction)......this same sequence holds for negative experiences and these typically may require assistance in sorting out.

Why do I take your time......again......with this observation.

- 1) Today I experienced t again,
- 2) it triggers a latent item on my brains bulletin board, namely...one of these days we will get another notice from Jack that he feels he must retire. I say well and good...certainly well earned......but then what of the Alum O & B he has developed.

Choices:

- 1) all good things come to an end,
- 2) "Carry on !" Provision for continuance would be considered and plans developed if deemed warranted.

I have touched on this in the past because of the perceived mental health as well as personal value this experience
