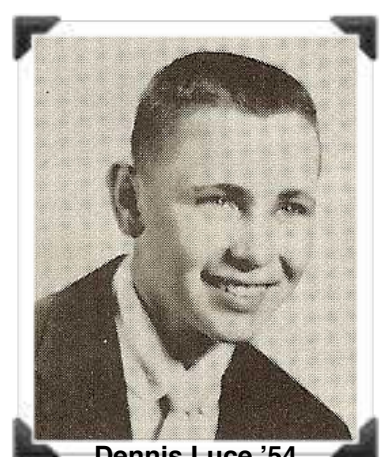

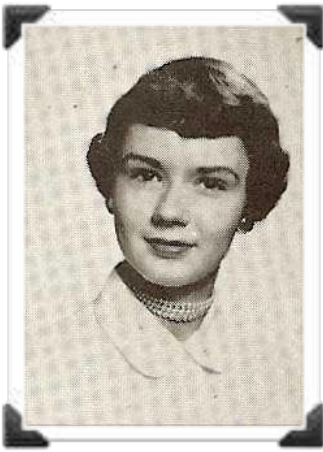

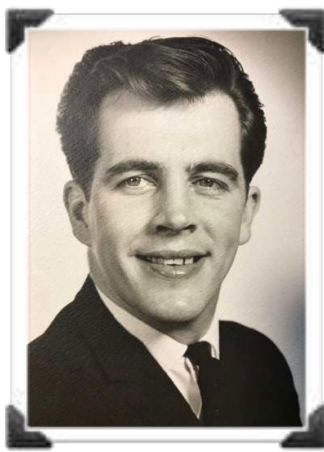

I'm a little late sharing my memory of Buddy Edelen, but here it is. I was an "also-ran" mile runner on the 1955 WHS Track Team. It was tough. WHS had Edelen, Bill Erickson and Bob Shuck and Madison High had two runners who pushed Buddy at every event. Someone mentioned that Buddy ran and won nine races that Spring. If memory serves me right, he also set a meet record each time as well.

The particular meet that I remember was the Corn Palace Relays in Michell. It was a typical spring day in South Dakota, miserably cold and raining with a strong wind just to top it off. The Mile Run was usually one of the later events, but that day it was moved up to mid-morning. I remember well that by the time the runners took their places, the track was already flooded in spots, but when the starting pistol was fired away we splashed. Somehow Buddy not only managed to win under those awful conditions but also lowered the meet record as well. After the last miler swam across the finish line, the rest of the meet was cancelled. I am convinced that the only reason the officials held the mile race that day was because of Buddy Edelen. But maybe Bill Erickson remembers differently!

The Texas Teen Fair

BOBBY VEE, my friend over 50 years hired my band (**Myron Lee and the Caddies**) to back him up on his tours for much of 1963-1965. We started in June of 1963 on the east coast playing all the beautiful summer resorts and then across country when later in the summer we were booked for 6 days at the same location in San Antonio for what was called The Texas Teen Fair. The shows started each day at 10am and we loved that because we had the rest of the days off. The line up was George Jones and the Jones Boys opening the show followed by Billy J. Kramer and the Dakotas (Little Children), Bobby Rydell, Bobby Vee and my band, and closing the show were THE ROLLING STONES.

BOBBY KEYS was playing sax in my band during this time period and what a stroke of luck he had because during the week Bobby and Keith Richards became fast friends and a few years later Keith gave Bobby a call and he became The Stones sax man and still is today. For the most part The Stones pretty much kept to themselves that week and didn't associate with any one else on the show. We thought at the time that all their success might have went to their heads. A few years ago my drummer, Stu Perry got to talk to Keith Richards at the Target Center in Minneapolis when he was there with his band. In the conversation The Texas Teen Fair came up and Keith remembered the name Myron Lee and the Caddies and how shy The Stones were because this was their first American Tour and first time they were around American musicians.

GEORGE JONES after doing his show each morning would head down the stairs with his band headed for the exit and I heard him yell more than once "Last call for alchy-ho!" They stayed at The Holiday Inn where we stayed and most afternoons his lady friend would be at the swimming pool with the rest of us while George stayed in his room and drank. One afternoon she said "Would you help me drag that old party pooper out here so we can throw him in the pool?" The suggestion sounded fun so the 6 of us grabbed him from his bed and we threw a kicking and screaming George Jones in the pool. We had hoped he would join us but he said a few more choice words and back to his room he went. We all loved George and were big fans of his long before this tour.

Bobby Rydell's manager would drive up just before Bobby's show time. They would get out of the car, Bobby would do this show with a house band, they would get back in the car and we wouldn't see them again until the next show. Very strange we all thought. I know Rydell's always been a nice person and I don't know whos idea that was.

I stood back stage and watched all the other acts perform and the reception for everyone was great. We all had a GREAT time in San Antonio that week and the crowds for each show were big. Everything is big in Texas.

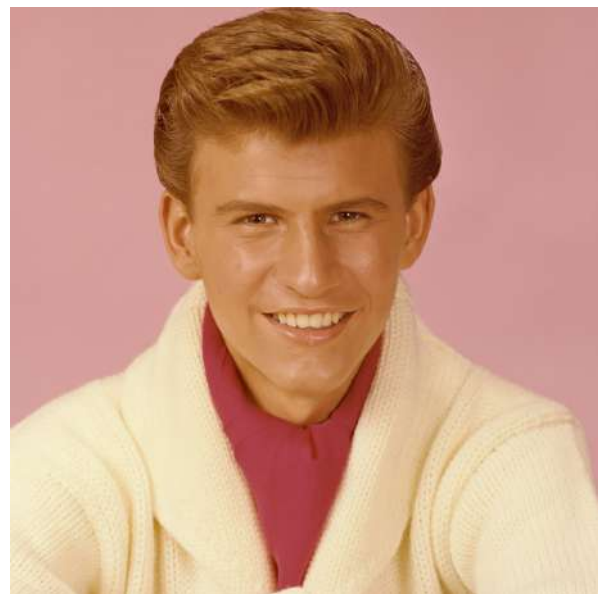

Dear Jack,

Just a quick note inspired by **Harry Klessen's '52** poem that **Bob Berguin '53** submitted for the last O&B Newsletter. Klessen was totally cool. So far as I know, he was the first guy at WHS to wear pegged pants, i. e., pants (including Levis) that tapered more sharply below the knees. It was a style initially adopted, he said, by the zoot suited Mexican Americans of Los Angeles. If Klessen had graduated from WHS it would have been in 1952, but he never graduated (due, he said, to failing one class in English). He went on teach shop classes at Lincoln High School for the remainder of his working years. As a runner and bicyclist he kept himself fit throughout his life. His artwork made him famous in Sioux Falls and far beyond. He taught shop classes at Lincoln High School throughout his working years.
