What to do when a loved one's death is imminent

Dear Savvy Senior: This may seem like a strange question, but can you tell me what steps need to be taken after a loved one dies? My 80-year-old father has a terminal illness, and I would like to find out what I will need to do when he passes.

— Only Daughter

Dear Only: I'm sorry about your father's situation, but this is a great question that many families inquire about when a loved one's death becomes imminent. Here's a rundown of some things you can do now, and after his death, that can help keep a sad event from becoming even more painful.

Before death

There are several tasks you can do while your father is living that will make things a lot easier and less hectic for you after he dies,

For starters, find out where your dad keeps all his important papers such as his will (also make sure it's updated), birth certifi-

cate, marriage and divorce certificates, Social Security information, life-insurance policies, military discharge papers, financial documents, and keys to a safe deposit box or home safe.

Ålso, if your dad doesn't have an advanced directive, help him make one (see caringinfo.org for free state-specific forms and instructions). An advanced directive includes a living will that specifies his end-of-life medical treatments and appoints a health-care proxy to make medical decisions if he becomes incapacitated.

In addition, you may also want to get a do-not-resuscitate order, which will tell health care professionals not to perform CPR when your dad's heart or breathing stops. Your dad's doctor can help you with this.

You should also prearrange his funeral and burial or cremation.

Immediately after death

Once your father dies, you'll need to get a legal pronouncement of death. If no doctor is present, you'll need to contact someone to do this. So, if your dad dies at home under hospice care, call the hospice nurse, who can declare his death and help facilitate the transport of the body.

If he dies at home without hospice care, call 911, and have in hand his do-not-resuscitate document, Without one, paramedics will generally start emergency procedures and, except where permitted to pronounce death, take the person to an emergency room for a doctor to make the declaration.

If no autopsy is needed, you will need to call the funeral home, mortuary or crematorium to pick up the body. If your dad is an organ or tissue donor, contact the funeral home or the county coroner immediately.

Within a few days

If funeral plans were not prearranged, you'll need to make arrangements and prepare an obituary. If your dad was in the military or belonged to a fraternal or religious group, you should contact those organizations because they may have burial benefits or conduct funeral services.

Up to 10 days after death

To wind down your dad's financial affairs, you'll need to get multiple copies of his death certificate. These are typically provided by the funeral home.

If you're the executor of your dad's estate, take his will to the appropriate county or city office to have it accepted for probate. And open a bank account for

your dad's estate to pay bills, including taxes, funeral costs, etc.

You also need to contact your dad's estate attorney if he has one; tax preparer to see if estate or final income taxes should be filed; financial adviser for information on financial holdings; life insurance agent to get claim forms; his bank to locate and close accounts; and Soclal Security (800-772-1213) and other agencies that provided benefits to stop payments and, if applicable, ask about survivor benefits. You should also cancel his credit cards and, if relevant, stop household services such as utilities, mail, etc.


I am in contact with the Howard Wood committee to place a historical marker at the old site ,on East 10th Street. We are looking at placing it near where the Drake Springs Pool was.


A neat Sioux Falls note, on the old H W field is:

In Tribute

TO A GREAT COACH

HOWARD



HOWARD WOOD, reared in Ontario, Can., and Potsdam, N. Y., and a graduate of Purdue University, came to Washington High School of Sioux Falls in 1908.

He had coached one year at Rugby, N. D. Thereafter, except for two years as football coach at North Dakota State College in Fargo (1913-15), he continued as athletic director at Washington High School until his death on Feb. 21, 1949. In most of those years he was head football coach, head basketball coach and head track and field coach.

This seldom-equalled length of service, marked by long lists of championships; his constant study of new developments, his high competitive spirit and his fund of tales for inspiring his athletes and entertaining audiences made Wood an outstanding sports figure in the north central states and well-known in the highest coaching circles of the nation.

Thousands of Sioux Falls homes felt the influence of this student of youngsters and their problems, as Wood sought to bring out the best in "his boys" through four decades.

A keen strategist in football and a master trainer of track and field athletes, "The Little General" continued to coach these sports into 1948, after relinquishing basketball a few years before.


The public schools athletic field on East 10th St., where his two favorite sports were directed for so many years, was given his name. The annual Dakota Relays he founded became the Howard Wood Dakota Relays in memoriam.

The new public schools stadium, successor to Howard Wood Field on East 10th St., will continue to honor his outstanding contribution to Sioux Falls with the name, Howard Wood Memorial Field.





They had a four piece band and sounded just like their recordings. We had a packed house and their price then was \$1500.00 which was a lot of money then. The ticket price was \$2.00 advance and \$2.50 at the door. They were really nice guys."
