

Chief Justice Robert A. Miller (Ret.)
Third District, Pierre

Retired Chief Justice Robert A. Miller was born August 28, 1939, in Aberdeen. He received his business degree from USD in 1961 and his law degree in 1963. After serving two years as an assistant attorney general, he practiced law for six years in Philip, serving as state's attorney and city attorney. He was appointed to the Sixth Circuit bench in 1971 and was presiding judge of the circuit from 1976 until 1986. He received his appointment to the Supreme Court in 1986 and was retained by the voters in the 1990 general election and again in the 1998 general election. He was elected to 4-year terms as Chief Justice by the members of the Supreme Court in 1990, 1994 and 1998. He retired in September 2001. Retired Chief Justice Miller has been President of the State's Attorneys' Association and of the Judges' Association and Chair of the S.D. Retirement System Board of Trustees. He serves as a Court Counsellor at South Dakota Boys State. He is a former member of the Board of Directors of the National Conference of Chief Justices, and serves on several of its committees, currently chairing its Resolutions Committee. He is liaison between the Conference of Chief Justices and the national Council of State Governments and serves on the CSG Executive Committee. In 1998 he was appointed by President Clinton to serve on the Board of Directors of the State Justice Institute and presently serves as chair of that organization. He and his wife Shirlee are the parents of five children.




In 2011, I was inducted into the SD Hall of Fame joining two other W.H.S. 1957 graduates, Dr. Frank Alvine and Peter Hegg.


