Sorry you are having trouble with your class list. Dealing with out of date, incomplete and inaccurate lists is probably the biggest single problem that every reunion organizer has ever had to deal with since the beginning of reunions.

But, congratulations on doing such a great job in helping to update the deceased list for your class that I try to maintain. You have just given me 20 new names that I will now add to the Class of '50's deceased list. There were only 157 names on my last published, "'50 list". Comparing that number with the numbers I have for other classes from the '50s

decade I knew I was missing a lot of unknown deaths in the class of 1950.

Since I published the last '50s deceased list on Dec. 26, 2019, I also have two more names to be added. They are Carol Anawski '50 and Marlee Gefke '50. So with 157 from my Dec 2019 list, plus the 20 names you just sent me and the additional 2 names I have to add, that brings the total known deceased members for the class of 1950 to 179. That number of 179 deceased for your class is now much more comparable with the other classes from the fifties. For example, my class of 1954 has the nighest number of known deaths at this time with 189.

About the only thing more I can think of to do to help you is to print either this letter from you as it is, or anything else you would like for me to publish in the next O&B. If I don't hear any more from you I will just proceed in publishing this email from you as it is.

Now, in regards to Dorothy Adams Trindel '50, She died in Winnsboro, TX on May 1, 2011. She was married to, Martin Kent Trindel, for 57 years. He also died in Winnsboro, TX on Sept. 9. 2014.

Good luck on getting your 1950 Class Reunion organized for this summer. I certainly strongly encourage all members of the WHS Class of 1950 to attend and support Elliott's wonderful efforts. Jack Phillips '54


choose to send another issue, I will devour it promptly. One idea is to cut back on the frequency of new issues.
