

Jack, The Feb. 3rd edition was a pleasure to read. I especially enjoyed Ms. Teters' (nee Walt's) comments about the Marines, as I am the second generation of four generations of enlisted Marines. My grandson (4th generation) is in the USMCR while attending college at Maryland.

So, the Kayls appreciate her comments about Marines who rescue downed pilots. If it were that you or any of your readers are familiar with the movie "Behind Enemy Lines," [The movie is based upon the heroic exploits of USAF Capt. O'Grady, who sued Fox over the film and a documentary on him.] then they might recall that, near the end of the movie, Capt. O'Grady (in the movie it's a different name) is informed that Marines from the USS Kearsarge are in the air to rescue him from the Serbs.

Well, a South Dakotan, my youngest son (a Roosevelt High grad), was on this mission/detail with other 2nd Marine Division Marines (infantry) from the USMC Expeditionary Force. For two-and-one-half years prior to being transferred to the 2ndMarDiv, he served in Marine Corps Security Forces on the USS Independence, stationed in Yokosuka, Japan and one of MCSF's specialties is finding and rescuing downed pilots. Hence, the reason that he was assigned to this mission.

(Since his discharge from the Marines, he has worked in federal law enforcement for almost 20 years. His older brother, a WHS Class of '87 grad, is a U. S. Army [enlisted] combat veteran of Desert Storm and today is a teacher at Harrisburg Middle School and on the WHS Hall of Fame and Historical Committees.) Jeff Kayl Sr. '69

Hi Jack, Hope all is well out there. It is HOT here and we desperately need rain! Never thought I'd say that in Fla. I do wonder about the flooding in East River SD. We seldom get much news on that here but the other night they did show flood areas in SD, ND, and Minnesota on a map. I pray things are not as bad there as in Oklahoma and further East.

In the course of cleaning out things after my husband's death, my son, the last time they were down, brought two boxes in from the utility room and said "Mom, these moved with us from Minnesota and I don't think they have ever been opened. (he was three then so I have no idea how he knew they came south with us.) We need

to see what is in them and get rid of stuff if it isn't needed." On jobs such as that I can procrastinate forever and have done so. However, several weeks ago I finally went through the boxes, ones I know I packed prior to the move south, have absolutely no memory of most of the stuff in them, and found a treasure of old pictures, a bathrobe and crib "spread" I honestly remember using!!! I spent several days going through pictures and finally reached the bottom of the one box, unearthing my FRESHMAN GREEN BEANIE!

Does anyone remember those days? My freshman year of HS I was at Cathedral High so my beanie is from there. I lived in fear of being "caught", having my face smeared with lipstick and having to go beg pennies but eventually a Senior girl I hardly knew hung the "collection box" around my neck and painted my face. I was so scared and mortified but I went up to Graff Motors where Dad worked and got him to throw some change in the box, as did others. My dad laughed his wonderful laugh and told me to enjoy the experience because if the girl hadn't thought I was worth "painting" I'd have been ignored. The rest of the afternoon was a much more pleasant experience. I didn't get much money for her as I recall but people laughed and told me to keep on going. I suppose such a "tradition" is really not PC today but I do think it was good for all of us. It certainly hurt no one, gave each of us some notoriety for a few hours and brought smiles and laughter to many. I can hardly wait for my 10 year old Granddaughter's next visit to show her the beanie and explain the tradition. She thinks many of the things I remember from back then are too weird so I will enjoy her reaction. If nothing else it will give her something to tell her friends about!
